Documents Required

- Will if available (notarized)
- Succession certificate
- Death certificate (notarized)
- Passport the deceased person (attested by Beneficiary)
- Valid Government issued photo ID of the Beneficiary (self-attested by beneficiary)

Duly Filled Forms Required (please find below)

- <u>Claim Form</u> duly filled duly stamped and signed by the Notary Public
- <u>Declaration cum Indemnity-Intestate</u> (incase Will is not available) or <u>Declaration cum Indemnity-Testate</u> (incase Will is available) duly stamped and signed by the Notary Public on a Rs. 50 stamp paper
- <u>Letter of Release</u> to be filled & signed by all other legal heirs except Beneficiary duly stamped and signed by the notary public on a Rs. 50 stamp paper.
